Flux sponsors Copenhagen Suborbitals ambitious mission to launch a human being into space, as we find the project both ingenious and inspirational

Flux 's own involvement in space, stems back to the Arriane 5 orbital launch platform, built under the direction of ESA.

Copenhagen Suborbitals is a non-profit suborbital space endeavor, based entirely on sponsors and volunteers.

Two rocket vehicles are currently under development. A small unmanned sounding rocket, named Hybrid Atmospheric Test Vehicle or HATV and a larger booster rocket named Hybrid Exo Atmospheric Transporter or HEAT, designed to carry a micro spacecraft on a suborbital trajectory in space.

The mission has a 100% peaceful remit and is not in any way involved with the carrying of explosive, nuclear, biological and chemical payloads.

Copenhagen Suborbitals will present a mission briefing and results achieved at an event hosted by Flux in Asnaes, on April 27th.
